**ENDORSEMENT**

**Honourable Paul Mayer**

A first Case Management Conference (CMC) was held by teleconference on February 25, 2019, at 4:30 P.M., Eastern Time (Ottawa).

[1] The Parties reported that they are optimistic about the possibility that the Claim may be resolved by settlement. The Respondent is currently reviewing the Claim for this purpose and expects to have an update for the next CMC.

[2] The Parties sought guidance on Rule 49 of the *Specific Claims Tribunal Rules of Practice and Procedure* and the Tribunal's Practice Direction # 12. For the next CMC, the Parties will prepare briefs addressing Rule 49 and as many elements of Practice Direction # 12 as are feasible.

[3] The Claimant will consider whether it will pursue Elder evidence and a site visit. The possible need to preserve Elder evidence was discussed. The Parties may begin work on an Oral History Protocol and a Site Visit Protocol prior to the next CMC, as appropriate.

[4] If the Parties wish to hold the Early Case Planning CMC described in Practice Direction # 12 in-person and an oral history evidence hearing and/or site visit are also intended, then the Parties may wish to hold these events at the same time. Dates and logistics for the oral history evidence hearing, site visit, and Early Case Planning CMC may be considered at the next CMC.

[5] The next CMC will be held by teleconference on **April 30, 2019**, at 4:30 P.M., Eastern Time (Ottawa).
